# Social Services

# Medicare Medicaid Alignment Initiative (MMAI)

Do you have Medicare Part A and Medicare Part B, as well as Medicaid with no spend down? If so and you are aged 21 or older, you are eligible for the Medicare Medicaid Alignment Initiative (MMAI) that allows you to access all of your benefits in one plan.

The Township's Senior Services and Disability Services staff are certified Senior Health Insurance Program (SHIP) Counselors and are able to help with MMAI options. Call us at 847-884-0030 to schedule an appointment today.

#### Access to Care

If you have no medical insurance or a high deductible plan you may qualify for Access to Care. The program provides access to primary care physicians and prescription assistance. Access to Care is not health insurance but can provide the assistance needed to access healthcare services. The program is available to all residents residing in Suburban Cook County regardless of immigration status. Access to Care members receive primary doctor visits for \$5 copay, lab and x-ray tests for \$5 copay, and prescription assistance averaging to \$15-\$40 per medication. To apply for the program you can go online to http:// accesstocare.org/application/ or contact Welfare Services at 847-884-0030 for assistance.

#### **Furnace Assistance**

Furnace Assistance provides repairs to heating systems that are not operational or have been red tagged by their utility companies. The program is designed to restore the home's heating system back to a safe and effective operation. Assistance is only available to home owner approved households that have or are eligible to receive a LIHEAP benefit. There services are free of charge for income qualifying households. For more information or to see if you qualify call the Township at 847-884-0030.

#### Weatherization Program

Home owners may be eligible to receive Weatherization assistance. Weatherization helps to make the home as energy efficient as possible by enhancing indoor air quality and ventilation; replacement or repair of heating and cooling systems; sealing drafty areas; and insulation for attics, walls, basements, and crawl spaces. These services will help to keep homes warmer in winter and cooler in summer. Households must meet the income guidelines identified by the program and be able to provide supporting documentation. The home must be structurally suitable to receive energy efficiency work. Call the Township at 847-884-0030 to see if you qualify.



#### **Comcast Internet Essentials**

Comcast (Xfinity) provides internet as low as \$9.95 per month to people who receive government assistance programs like housing choice vouchers, Medicaid, SNAP, and SSI. The Internet Essentials includes 25 Mbps of internet service, no activation fees or equipment rental fees, option to purchase a computer, access to free internet training online or in person, and access to Xfinity Wi-Fi hotspots. To qualify you must live in a Comcast service area, not an existing Xfinity customer or had Comcast (Xfinity) in the last 90 days, and have no outstanding debt to Comcast that is less than 1 year old. # More Services

#### **Free Cellphone Service**

Safelink Wireless provides free cell phone service to qualifying individuals. The service plan would provide 350 minutes plus 4.5GB of data each month. A compatible cell phone is required to access services. To qualify you must either:

- Receive SNAP (food stamps), Medicaid, HUD Housing Choice Voucher, or SSI OR
- Income is less than 135% of the federal poverty level

#### Illinois State Library Talking Book and Braille Service

The Talking Book and Braille Service (TBBS) provides free books and magazines in cassettes, braille, and descriptive video. Active Talking Book participants can download digital books on to their smartphones or tablets. Free equipment is also available in the form of Digital Talking Book Machines that can play flash memory cartridges and high-volume players for those who are hard of hearing. #### **ITAC Program**

The Illinois Telecommunications Access Corporation's (ITAC) program offers amplified phones, cell phone amplifiers, and accessories to qualified Illinois residents with a certified hearing loss. There are five phones and two cell phone amplifiers to choose from and every three years you are eligible for another piece of equipment.

For more information or to test the phones call us at 847-285-4541. If you are unable to come in to test the phones, clients can still apply for the program and choose a device over the phone.

#### Home Accessibility Program

Illinois Housing Development Authority Home Accessibility Program provides low-income homeowners with remodeling assistance to make the home more accessible. The program can provide the following improvements: grab bars, chair lifts, handicap accessible showers, lowering cabinets, lowering counter tops, widening doorways, ramps, walk-in showers, and more. Eligible homeowners can qualify for a grant up to \$25,000 for home modifications that will be forgivable after 5 years. #### Library Open to the Public

The Schaumburg Township District Library is now open to the public. Services available in-person include browsing, use of public computers, printer services, and more. #### Vaccine Available

Illinois has moved in to Phase 1b (Part 1 & 2) of the Vaccination Program. Phase 1b allows for people age 65 and older, essential workers, and people with disabilities to be vaccinated. To better streamline appointment availability and vaccine updates Cook County recently created a sign up website at https://vaccine.cookcountyil.gov/. The website provides updates on the current Phase in Illinois, information on scheduling vaccine appointments, and vaccine distribution locations in Cook County. Appointments are updated throughout the week at various times. Many pharmacies like Jewel-Osco, CVS, Walgreens, etc. can also add people to their vaccine waitlists online or by phone.

#### Social Security Closed to Public

The Social Security Administration offices remain closed to the public except by appointment only. Social Security has expanded many of their online services to provide as much assistance as possible. With a "my Social Security" account you can request a replacement social security card and Medicare card, view your latest statements, print proof of your Social Security benefits, print your 1099, change your address, apply for disability benefits, and appeal decisions. The Social Security website also has useful tools and articles to help assist with any common questions you might have. Visit their website at www.ssa.gov.

#### **Unemployment Fraud**

Recently there have been a rise in identity theft in regards to receiving unemployment benefits. If you receive a letter in the mail from Illinois Department of Employment Security (IDES) and have not filed an unemployment claim, follow these steps:

- Contact IDES Fraud Hotline by phone at 800-814-0513 or online at https://www2.illinois.gov/ides/ Pages/Contact-IDES\_Form.aspx.
- Report the fraud online to the Federal Trade Commission (FTC) at https://reportfraud.ftc.gov/#/.
- Contact the three credit bureaus (Equifax, Experian, TransUnion) to put a lock on the credit file and an alert should anyone try to open any new accounts.
