CALL EARLY FOR YOUR RIDE

Due to the increase in ridership, the Transportation Department recommends riders to schedule their rides earlier than normal. The Transportation Department will do their best to accommodate every ride request. Same day service is not available. RTA PROGRAM

The Disability Services Department is an RTA Site for the Ride Free Program and Reduced Fare Program. Depending on eligibility, individuals with a permanent disability may be eligible for the transit pass.


WINTER DRIVING TIPS



Stay safe driving this winter with the following great tips from AARP:

- Check your car battery by turning on the headlights, then start the engine. If the lights brighten when the engine is running, your battery's weak.
- Make sure windshield washer fluid and engine antifreeze levels are full.
- Keep your trunk stacked with winter gear of battery jumper cables, snow brush/ice scraper, cat litter or sand to put under slipping wheels if you're stuck, small shovel, flashlight and batteries, phone charger, drinking water and snacks.
- Clean the inside and outside of the windshield and rear window. Defrost and deice the windshield before you drive.
- Wipe snow and slush off your headlights, brake lights and turn signals.
- Drive slowly! Trying to start too quickly, even with all-wheel drive or traction control, can leave you stuck in place. Abruptly changing speeds — up or down — can cause the tires to slip and spin. (AARP.org)

SOCIAL SERVICES



FURNACE PROGRAM

Furnace Assistance Program is designed to help income eligible households get their property's furnace, boiler or heater repaired or replaced if they are not working properly or are red-tagged.

To qualify you must be the homeowner living in the property and be incomeeligible. If you have been approved for LIHEAP, clients are automatically eligible to apply for this program.

MMAI

Medicare-Medicaid Alignment Initiative (MMAI) plans combine all of a member's health care and prescription drug benefits under a single set of benefits.

To be eligible for MMAI, beneficiaries must be at least 21 years old, entitled to Medicare Part A, enrolled in Medicare Parts B and D, have full Medicaid in Aged, Blind and Disabled (AABD) category and are not eligible for Medicaid spend-down.

MMAI also offers care coordination to all its enrollees to assist them in meeting their health care goals.

NICOR GAS SHIELD OF CARING GRANT

Shield of Caring is a new energy and emergency assistance program administered by The Salvation Army to help residential customers who are past-due on their Nicor Gas bill and have a financial hardship including job loss, illness, military deployment, disability or other circumstance.

To qualify for the grant, household gross income in the last 30 days for a one-person household is \$4,293; two-person household is \$5,807. Customers may be eligible to receive a grant of up to \$250 once every two years to apply to their past due account balances.
