This year has been an exercise in adaptability. At the Township we are keeping residents engaged with interesting and fun things to do while at home. The programs are mostly conducted via Zoom, but we are slowly and carefully bringing back in-person activities. Here is a run-down of how we've kept things fun and fresh at the Township!

• Art – The Township has a monthly art class called Art Expressions where participants can follow along with a local artist to create some beautiful pieces of art! There is a small fee for materials and RSVP is required so we can get you the supplies ahead of the session.

• Education Sessions – We've covered topics like Medicare, Social Security's Ticket to Work Program, your rights under the ADA, scams, tips on downsizing, utility savings and more!

- Entertainment We offer weekly games like bingo, Scattergories and trivia. We also have hosted several virtual tours of extraordinary locations in Italy as well as local and national museums and attractions.
- Exercise To keep our bodies healthy and strong, we have chair yoga and Tai Chi classes weekly. These activities are held over Zoom so participants can join in from their living room, outside patio, or wherever they are most comfortable.

Medicare Part C/D Annual Enrollment Period October 15th – December 7th

Medicare can be quite complicated. If you already have Medicare or are approaching 65, you may be inundated with mail advertising private companies' Medicare options.

We can help! The annual enrollment period for Medicare Part C ("Advantage") and Part D ("Prescription Drugs") occurs every year from October 15th – December 7th. The Township has several trained counselors in the Senior Health Insurance Program (SHIP). SHIP is a program from the Illinois Department on Aging, and designed to help older adults with their Medicare and other health insurance options. We provide free, unbiased information.

If you would like to meet with a counselor, please contact (847) 285-4541 for an appointment. Due to COVID-19, we are happy to conduct your appointment over the phone. Please call today as in-person appointments may fill quickly. You can also call 1-800-MEDICARE or the State of Illinois SHIP Hotline at (800) 252-8966 for assistance. We look forward to assisting you with the annual enrollment period, or other Medicare questions.

AARP Income Tax Assistance Early February – April

Each year, the Township partners with AARP to provide FREE income tax assistance. AARP Tax Aide seeks to assist low- to moderate-income taxpayers file their state and federal returns at no cost. Appointments will be available from early February through April. Individuals are reminded to contact our office after January 25th, 2021, to schedule an appointment. Appointments will be scheduled in date order to ensure the most individuals can be assisted with this phenomenal program. Due to COVID-19, this program is subject to change. Vote by Mail Options in Cook County

As of August 18^{th} , 2020 the Cook County Clerk's Office announced over 50 locations for mail ballot dropboxes. On October 19^{th} , dropboxes will be available at many Early Voting locations from 8:30-7 PM Monday - Friday and 9-5 PM on weekends (depending on location). The nearest confirmed dropbox locations to the Township building are:

According to the Cook County Clerk's Office, "mail ballots [dropped off at secure dropbox locations] will be collected on a daily basis and will be time stamped. Voters who applied for their mail ballot online will receive an email at the time their mail ballot is sent to them, as well as an email notifying them when the completed ballot has been received back from the voter." Utility Assistance Available!

The Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) assists low-income residents with a one-time credit on their heating and electric bill. This year, the income standard has increased, allowing for more residents to qualify than in years past. In order to ensure all households have access to benefits sooner, there will be no priority periods this year. Shorter days and the chill in the air reminds us that snow and ice are not far away. While COVID-19 has made this a year unlike any other, some constants remain the same.

Please remember that when roadways become slick, drivers should allow for more time to stop, especially when snow plows are on the roads. Snow removal equipment require a wide berth when approaching or passing. 
Please be mindful of the environment when you apply salt to your sidewalks and driveways. Even in the winter, swales should be clear of debris and leaves to allow for proper drainage. Finally, remember to winterize your rain barrels. If you cannot store your barrel inside, be sure to drain it and turn it upside down, preferably covered with a tarp, to avoid water collecting and freezing over the winter months.

Automatic Renewal of Three Property Tax Exemptions in 2021 due to COVID-19

As a reminder earlier this year, Governor Pritzker signed Senate Bill 685, which automatically renews three homestead exemptions for the next property tax year (2020). These exemptions are the Persons with Disabilities Exemption, the Veterans with Disabilities Exemption, and/or



the Senior Freeze Exemption. Homeowners who are qualified to receive any of these three exemptions, but have not received them in the past will need to apply as new applicants. This renewal will be for one tax year only.

Lastly, Township seniors currently receiving a Senior Homestead Exemption will receive automatic renewals for this exemption until 2024.

Cook County Board of Review Virtual Appeals

Cook County Board of Review appeals are typically available towards the end of the year. The Township can help residential property owners appeal if there are available comparable properties for a second review. Residents can appeal regardless of recent appeals with the Cook County Assessor's Office and/or the Cook County Board of Review. If your assessment was reduced during the last triennial reassessment (2019), and you have found no comparable properties, your assessment will remain the same until the next triennial reassessment (2022).

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, we encourage residents to take advantage of our virtual appeal options. The most convenient and quickest way to appeal is via email to Victor Morales vmorales@schaumburgtownship.org. You'll need to provide:

- Your name
- Home address
- Property index number
- Phone number
- Email address
- If you purchased your home on or after January 1, 2017, we need to know your purchase price.

We will continue to hold evening hours during the appeals period. Final appeals dates will be available here: cookcountyboardofreview.com.

Please note that successful appeals are not retroactive, thus they will reflect on your next *second installment* property tax bill in 2021. Unfortunately, we cannot appeal for residents who live in condominiums. If you live in a condo, please contact your association as they are able to appeal on your behalf.

COVID-19 and the Flu

Influenza (flu) and COVID-19 are both contagious respiratory illnesses. However, because some of the symptoms are similar, it may be hard to tell the difference between them based on symptoms alone. Flu and COVID-19 share many characteristics and both can have varying degrees of signs and symptoms, ranging from no symptoms (asymptomatic) to severe symptoms including:

- Fever or feeling feverish/chills
- Cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Fatigue (tiredness)
- Sore throat
- Runny or stuffy nose
- Muscle pain or body aches
- Headache

One of the commonly cited symptoms of COVID-19 that differs from the flu is the loss of sense of taste and smell. Both illnesses can result in severe complications. Those at highest risk are older adults, people with certain underlying medical conditions and pregnant women.

This year more than ever, please consult with your physician regarding the flu vaccine, and the pneumonia vaccine if you are 65+ or have a respiratory illness. You may also want to discuss the shingles vaccine with your physician, as all three can be given during this upcoming flu season. Please contact the Township nurse with any questions.
