A1C TESTING

Nurse Janet is available to test your A1C for \$12 by appointment only at 847-285-4551. The A1C diabetes test is a finger stick, non-fasting blood test that measures your average blood sugar level over the past three months.


ITAC PROGRAM APPLICATIONS

- 1. Doctor or Audiologist
- 2. Speech-Language Pathologist
- 3. Hearing Aid Specialist
- 4. Nurse Practitioner/Physician's Asst.

ITAC provides free telecommunications equipment— amplified phones, captioned phones, cell phone amplifiers— to any IL resident who has difficulty hearing on the standard phone. Come to our office to see the phones today!

CUB UTILITY CLINIC

With rates increasing, come and have Citizens Utility Board (CUB) specialist review your utility bills on Monday, July 11 from 10am-12pm.

A CUB specialist can check if you're signed up with an alternative supplier, paying for unnecessary products and services, measure your usage to compare to others consumers, advise on eligible money-saving programs (including financial assistance) and guide you to free energy-efficiency products and services.

NOTARY SERVICES

Our receptionist, Diane Saverson, is a notary public who can notarize most of your documents at the Township. Please note the Township cannot notarize Cook County Quit Claim Deed or other conveyance of property in Cook County. Diane is available Monday through Friday from 8:30am-5pm. Valid identification to notarize the document is required.

LOW-INCOME SUBSIDY (LIS)


Medicare's Part D (prescription drug) Low Income Subsidy (LIS) helps cover prescription drug plan costs.

Depending on the beneficiaries income and assets, LIS either covers "full" or "partial" Part D costs, including monthly Part D premiums, deductibles, and copayments.

Monthly Income limit Asset Limit
1 person—\$1,554 1 Person—\$9,000
2 person—\$2,085 2 Person—\$15,600

**If you receive either Medicaid, SSI, or enrolled in a Medicare Savings Program (MSP) you do not need to apply for LIS as you will be automatically enrolled in LIS.



MEDICARE SAVINGS PROGRAM (MSP)

The Medicare Savings Program (MSP) is State Medicaid program that can help pay your Medicare premiums, deductibles and coinsurances for Medicare beneficiaries who qualify.

There are three MSP program levels in which to qualify. Contact our office to see if you qualify and schedule an appointment to apply.

MMAI

If you have full Medicare and Medicaid, also known as "dual-eligible", you could qualify for the Medicare Medicaid Alignment Initiative (MMAI) program. MMAI provides all your medical services in one plan, and other services, such as transportation, vision, dental, meals and more that Original Medicare and Medicaid do not cover.

- All persons with disabilities must have an able-bodied adult to accompany them on the rides. No exceptions.
- NOT ALL RIDES WILL BE OPEN! The carnival operator is a separate entity and has sole discretion on which rides will be open.

The event is dependent on weather and may be cancelled or delayed. The event will not be rescheduled if cancelled. This program is not open to the public. Free Rides is hosted by the Village of Schaumburg, sponsored by Fantasy Amusement Company, Inc. and coordinated by the Township of Schaumburg Disability Services


PACK THE BUS
