FOOD PANTRY NUTRITION GUIDANCE



The Schaumburg Township Food Pantry, in partnership with the Illinois Department of Public Health Institute, has developed written nutrition guidelines. These guidelines have been created for donors to promote health and nutrition for our pantry clients. They will help educate donors on the best foods to donate and on how nutritious food options in the pantry can combat issues like chronic dietary diseases. Donor support will help us in providing nourishing options for our clients resulting in a healthier community. The guidelines are also inclusive of religious and ethnic food options to support our diverse residents.

One simple way for donors to help is to plant an extra row or two in your garden and donate the surplus to the pantry. The cost of fresh produce is particularly expensive and are popular pantry items. Your donations benefit children, seniors and families in need. We accept donations Monday - Friday from 8:30 - 5 pm and appreciate our generous community!

Greetings from Trustee Fiorio! I recently had the opportunity to visit all our Township Departments to meet our wonderful, hard-working and knowledgeable teams and leaders! It was a great experience and I learned quite a bit about the vast array of services that our Township offers.

Our Township Assessor's Office helps residents with property tax exemptions and appeals. The Clerk's Office assists with U.S. passports, notaries and voter registration. Our Community Health Nurse conducts low-cost to no-cost screenings for blood pressure, bone density, cholesterol and more. Disability Services offers help for Deaf residents and support groups. Welfare Services runs our food pantry, coordinates Mobile Dental Clinic applications and other assistance programs. Our Road and Bridge maintains unincorporated roads. Senior Services offers programs for residents aged 55+ such as exercise classes, cultural trips and educational workshops. Transportation Services help get residents to medical and dental appointments, shopping and social outings.

GET A RIDE TO MEDICAL APPOINTMENTS

The Township of Schaumburg is one of the few lowcost transportation options in the area for medical appointments like dialysis or cancer treatments. If you are a Township resident aged 55+ or have a permanent disability aged 18+, you qualify for our service. To start getting rides, you need to register with Transportation Services. Medical rides are offered up to 7 miles beyond Township borders. For more information call 847-882-1929. SUNSCREEN SAFETY

In just a few short weeks, summer will be upon us, and we will be anxious to soak up the sun. The warmth of the sun provides a wonderful feeling but it's important to note that it can be damaging to your skin and if you aren't careful it can cause skin cancer, and/or wrinkled, dry, discolored and leathery looking skin. Here are some suggestions on how to use sunscreen effectively to minimize damage:

- Sunscreen should be applied 20 minutes before going outdoors.
- Don't be too stingy! Coat your body with at least 1 ounce of sunscreen.
- Remember to include your ears, scalp, eyelids lips, neck, chest and feet.
- Sunscreen is not a one-apply-and-done product. It should be reapplied at least every 2 hours and more often if you sweat heavily or go swimming.
- Apply sunscreen evenly.
- Apply even on a cloudy day.
- Expired sunscreen may not provide the amount of protection listed on the bottle.

SENIOR AND DISABILITY SERVICES ADVISORY COMMITTEES

Did you know that Senior and Disability Services each have an advisory committee made up of community members appointed by the Board of Trustees? Each committee meets once a month, September – May, and works with the respective departments to meet the needs of the community.

The Senior Citizens Services Committee (SCSC) meets the 3rd Monday of each month at 7 pm. This committee currently has three vacancies.



The Committee for Persons with Disabilities (CFPD) meets the 2nd Tuesday of each month at 7 pm. This committee currently has two vacancies. Committee members should be a person with a disability, a primary caregiver or guardian of a person with a disability, or a person with advance skill, knowledge or experience serving people with disabilities.

Paper shredding is limited to four boxes or paper bags per person (1 cubic ft. or 15" x 12" x 10"). No plastic bags please. Boxes must be unsealed. Paper clips, staples and rubber bands do not need to be removed. We ask that participants enter our parking lot heading southbound on Illinois Blvd. so as not to block traffic on Schaumburg Road. GET YOUR PASSPORT AT THE TOWNSHIP

The Township of Schaumburg offers passport services for brand new passports and renewals Monday - Friday from 9 - 4 pm. No appointments are needed! Applicants are encouraged to visit schaumburgtownship.org or travel.state.gov for document requirements, instructions and processing times. There are two sets of fees for each application– one to the U.S. Department of State and one to the Township. Each application must include a check or money order. Neither cash nor debit/credit cards are accepted for the application fee that goes to the U.S. Department of State. The fees to the Township can be paid via cash, check or card. FROM THE DESK OF THE HIGHWAY COMMISSIONER : SCOTT M. KEGARISE

April showers bring May flowers. This is a season of rebirth, renewal and discovery. While the blooming flowers are a feast for the eyes, the rains that brought them can create a myriad of problems. Swales need to be cleared of winter debris. The Highway Department's right-of-way extends 33 feet from the centerline of the highway. While the Township isn't authorized to address backyard drainage issues, we can assist in determining where clogs are with our camera systems. It is good practice for homeowners to conduct routine maintenance in their own swale drainage pipes.

Wood chips are available for spring landscaping needs first-come, first-served. Supplies are limited. We also have rain barrels available for sale for \$55. Rain barrels save you money by storing water to be used for watering grass or gardens. Wood chips and rain barrels are delivered to Township residents at no cost.

PROPERTY TAX EXEMPTIONS

Did you know you can call or visit the Township Assessor's Office to verify that your exemptions for Tax Year 2021 were properly applied before the second installment bill is mailed this summer? If you haven't yet applied, all qualified, new homeowners, veterans with disabilities, or residents with disabilities may also visit our office to apply for exemption(s) if you haven't already.

Two common property tax exemptions are the Senior Citizen and/or Senior Freeze Exemptions.

- Senior Citizen Exemption: Residents born in (or prior to) 1956.
- Senior Freeze Exemption: Residents born in (or prior to) 1956 and have a total household income of \$65,000.00, as noted on the IRS 1040 form in Tax Year 2020.

All exemptions are applied only on the second installment of your property tax bill. Contact the Assessor's Office to find out more information.

Any resident can call to book a Coffee with the Assessor seminar, where Assessor John Lawson hosts a private meeting, of 5 – 15 guests, to discuss property tax appeals, exemptions and more.
