- c. ITAC Update

Over the past few months there has been a significant decrease in the number of phones available for selection through the ITAC program. Currently there is one cordless, one corded and one Captel phone available for residents to choose from. Manufacturers have stopped making some of the models. ITAC is working with manufacturers to see if other models can be made available.

d. Committee Member Comments and Questions

The Committee discussed the definition of developmental disabilities and the 708 Board funding guidelines. The committee members discussed focusing more on physical disabilities such as vision and hearing impairment, and other physical disabilities, as they consider agency funding for future years.

The committee recognized the death of disability rights activist, Judy Heumann. Judy was internationally known as a leader in the disability community and was a lifelong civil rights advocate for people with disabilities. She was instrumental in the development and implementation of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act, the Americans with Disabilities Act, the Rehabilitation Act, and the UN Convention on the Rights of persons with Disabilities.
