

NEW HEARING SERVICES AVAILABLE

NEW - The Americans for Better Hearing Foundation (ABHF) will be at the Township every 1st Wednesday of the month, 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., to administer low-cost hearing services. ABHF accepts ALL insurance, including Medicare and Medicaid. They also accept clients with no insurance and offer a Fair Pricing Program to help those who selfpay. Services include: hearing test, aural rehabilitation, hearing aid fittings & repairs, wax removal and hearing aid batteries. Appointments are required, with a physician medical referral.
