The new Schaumburg Township Mental Health Board is hard at work! We are learning about vital community needs regarding mental health, substance use disorders and developmental disabilities. In our community there are agencies with long waitlists for therapy, people battling opioid addictions and families worried about long-term supportive housing as their children enter adulthood. Service barriers come in many forms and include stigma, availability, cost and transportation.

We have the immense opportunity to lift each other up and out of these overlapping crises. The cost of inaction is simply too great. I am proud to serve alongside volunteer members who are passionate about bettering the lives of others and to be part of a community that is ready to raise those in need so that we all may thrive.

The Mental Health Board meets the first Tuesday of each month at 7 pm at the Township. Meetings are open to the public and volunteer support is welcome!

NEW SIGN-IN PROCESS LAUNCHING THIS FALL

The Township will launch a new visitor sign-in process at the main entrance this fall. All visitors, except those pre-registered for scheduled events, will be asked to sign-in and sign-out at our new security desk. Signing in will alert staff of your arrival for appointments and walk-in services and will keep a more accurate count of persons in the building in case of emergency. Guests will be asked to input their name and a general reason for visiting – entering an email is optional. Visitors are then asked to sign-out before exiting.

Township security staff will be available to help all guests through the transition. Visitors to the north entrance will continue to check-in at our Welfare Services reception desk upon entry. Any questions about the new process can be directed to Administrator Williams. As the Township grows and changes, we appreciate your flexibility. This new process will help staff better manage the increase in visitors we anticipate with our increase in space, programs and services.



THE IMPORTANCE OF WATER

Did you know your body is about 60% water? Your body uses water in its cells, organs and tissues to help regulate temperature and maintain other bodily functions. Your body loses water through breathing, sweating and digestion, so it's important to rehydrate by drinking fluids and eating foods that contain water. Thirst is the first sign of dehydration.

Your recommended water intake depends on the climate you live in, how physically active you are and whether you're experiencing an illness or have other health problems.

The Mayo Clinic recommends that men consume 3.7 liters (15.5 cups) and women consume 2.7 liters (11.5 cups) of fluids per day. This means drinking water or other beverages and eating food such as fruits and vegetables. The color of your urine can determine how well your fluid intake is. If it's very pale yellow to light yellow – you're well hydrated. Darker yellow is a sign of dehydration. Drink up!

MEDICARE PART C/D ANNUAL ENROLLMENT OCTOBER 15-DECEMBER 7

Medicare Annual Enrollment occurs every October 15-December 7, wherein recipients may enroll, change or disenroll from their Part C (Advantage) plan or change their Part D (prescription drug) plan. Plans get added and changed every year – if you have increased costs, non-covered prescription drugs or problems paying for your medications, it's worth reviewing your options. The Township has several Senior Health Insurance Program (SHIP) counselors who can provide free, unbiased Medicare information and education. Appointments can be made at 847-285-4541 and are required. Phone appointments and limited evening appointments are available. You can also call 800-MEDICARE or the State of Illinois SHIP Hotline at 800-252-8966 for assistance. We look forward to assisting you!

DRUG TAKEBACK PROGRAM

The Township is officially a Cook County Sheriff's Office Drug Takeback Program collection site. Drop off your unused and expired prescription and non-prescription drugs in the container on the south side of the Township building across from the handicap parking spaces. This service is free to use and completely anonymous. No liquids or syringes are accepted. Drugs should NOT be brought into the Township building. Senior and homebound residents may dispose of their unwanted medicine by calling 844-688-7379 and request a free, pre-paid and pre-labeled mail-back envelope sent to their home.

DELAYED SECOND INSTALLMENT PROPERTY TAX BILLS

Cook County second installment property tax bills are delayed this year and are expected as late as winter 2023. All exemptions filed in this year will be reflected on the upcoming second installment property tax bill. Contact the Township Assessor's Office at 847-285-4567 for more information.

UPCOMING COOK COUNTY BOARD OF REVIEW APPEALS

Residents can appeal their property taxes once more in 2023 with the Cook County Board of Review. Appeal dates are typically in the fall and can be confirmed on the Cook County Board of Review website (cookcountyboardofreview.com). Residents can also sign up for Township Assessor eNews on schaumburgtownship.org for free, up-to-date notices about appeals periods.

Residents can still file an appeal with the Board of Review regardless of previous successful or unsuccessful appeals from the Cook County Assessor's Office.

You can file an appeal for free with the assistance of our staff during the appeals period via email or in-person. E-appeals are the fastest and most convenient way to file - a visit to our office is not required.
