2024 PROGRAMMING UPDATE

Renovation projects are expected to continue at the Township heading into the new year, including the addition of a second floor over the gym. This additional space, plus the ability to divide our current gym into smaller spaces, will allow the Township to respond to the growing need for programs. This renovation will take most of 2024 and will require some adjustments to our current programming.

Beginning January 2, 2024, Disability & Senior Services will be partnering with St. Peter Lutheran Church and School and the Alfred Campanelli YMCA to continue offering our fitness classes. All classes will continue to be held at their regularly scheduled day and time. Program staff will be onsite for all classes and will have Class Passes available for purchase. 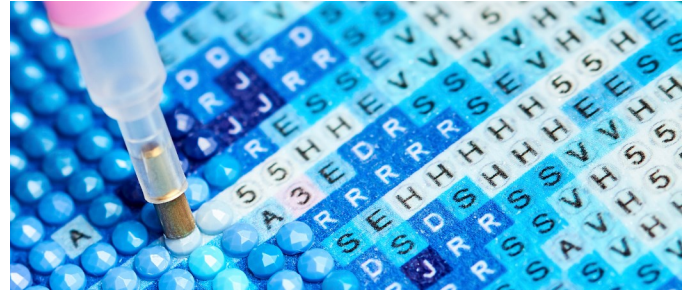

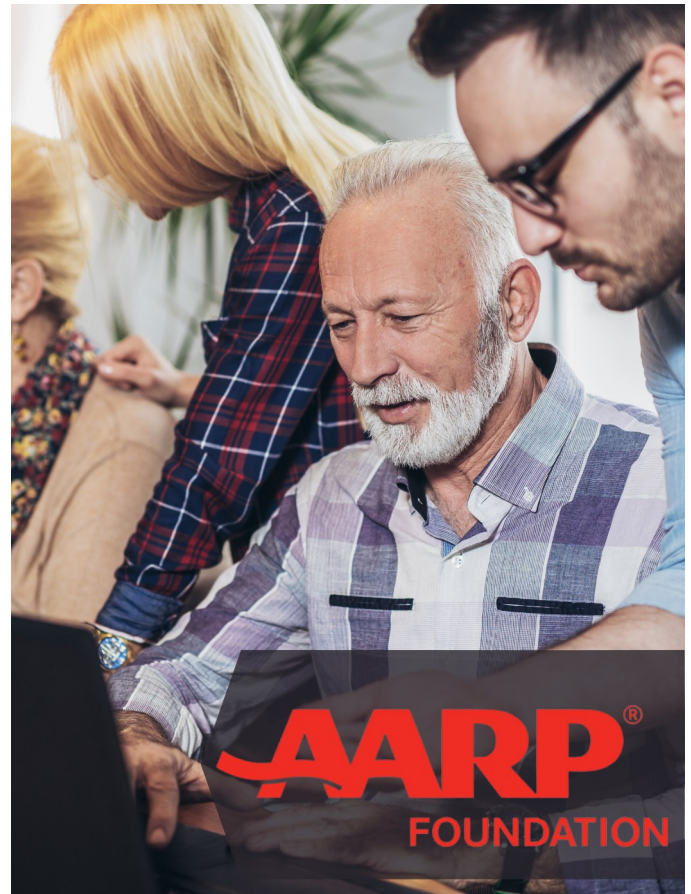

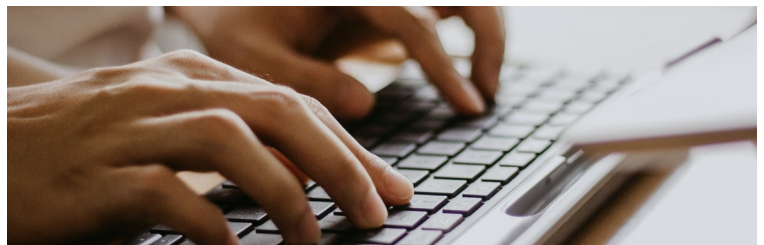

FEBRUARY IS BLACK HISTORY MONTH

Originally started as Negro History Week in 1926 by Carter G. Woodson, Black History Month was designated to pay deliberate time and attention to the history and accomplishments of Black Americans in history. Formally recognized by President Ford in 1976, February was chosen because the second week of the month coincides with Abraham Lincoln and Frederick Douglass’ birthdays and was traditionally a time when African Americans held celebrations in honor of emancipation.

TRANSPORTATION

With winter here, we know driving can be nerve wracking. Schaumburg Township Transportation is available to help get you to and from your medical appointments and shopping trips within the Township. Open to Seniors (55+) and adults with permanent disabilities (18+). Rides must be scheduled at least 3 days in advance and are available on a first come, first serve basis. Riders must be registered with Transportation prior to service, which can be completed over the phone. Rides are \$1 each way. Transportation is available Monday-Friday, 8:30am-3:30pm. FOOD PANTRY DONATIONS

The food pantry is in need of the following donations:

- Baby food/formula

SOCIAL SERVICES

SUPPLEMENTAL NUTRITION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

The SNAP program provides eligible households with a monthly benefit to supplement their grocery budgets to be able to purchase adequate, healthy food. The monthly SNAP benefit is determined based off a household's gross monthly income, housing expenses, and medical expenses. Each month, the SNAP benefits will be added to a LINK card that could be used to pay for food at most grocery stores.

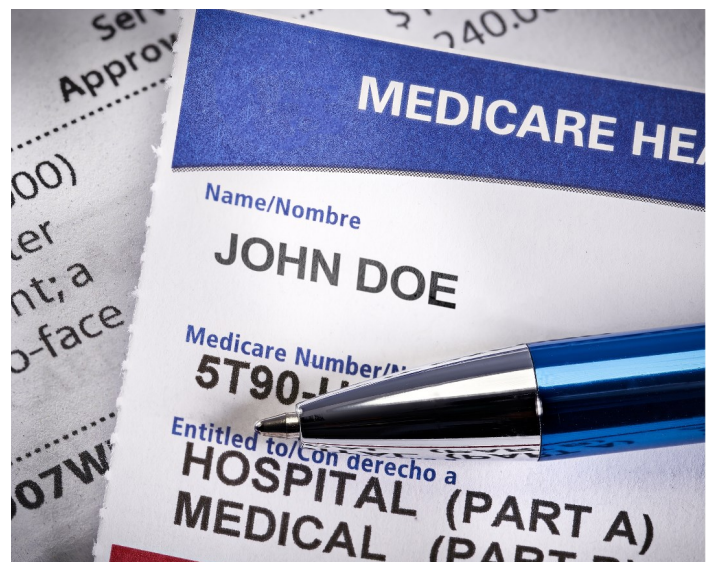
Gross monthly income criteria for households with someone 60+ or on disability:

1 person household	\$2,430
2 person household	\$3,286
3 person household	\$4,142

MEDICARE ADVANTAGE OPEN ENROLLMENT

From January 1 to March 31 each year, Medicare Advantage plan recipients can change Medicare Advantage plans or switch to traditional Medicare with a standalone prescription drug plan. If you are currently on a Medicare Advantage plan and would like to make a change, please call Disability and Senior Services at 847-285-4541 to schedule an appointment. You would need to provide your Medicare card, a list of your prescriptions with the dosage and frequency, and a list of your doctors.



SOCIAL SERVICES

MEDICARE ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS

Medicare Savings Programs (MSP) are state programs that assist Medicare beneficiaries with limited incomes and assets pay for Medicare Part A and B premiums and/or cost sharing amounts. You may qualify for a Medicare Savings Programs if you are a single person with a monthly income below \$1,665 and assets below \$9,090 or if you are a married couple with a monthly income below \$2,244 and assets below \$15,160.

Extra Help is a program to help Medicare beneficiaries with limited income and resources pay Part D premiums, deductibles, coinsurance, and other costs. To qualify for Extra Help, your income must be limited to \$21,870 for an individual or \$29,580 for a married couple. Also, your assets must be limited to \$16,660 for an individual or \$33,240 for a married couple.

Medicaid is a program that helps cover medical expenses for some people with limited income and resources. If you are on Medicare, to qualify for Medicaid your income must be below \$1,240/month and assets below \$17,500 for a single person. For a couple, your income must be below \$2,268/month and assets below \$17,500.

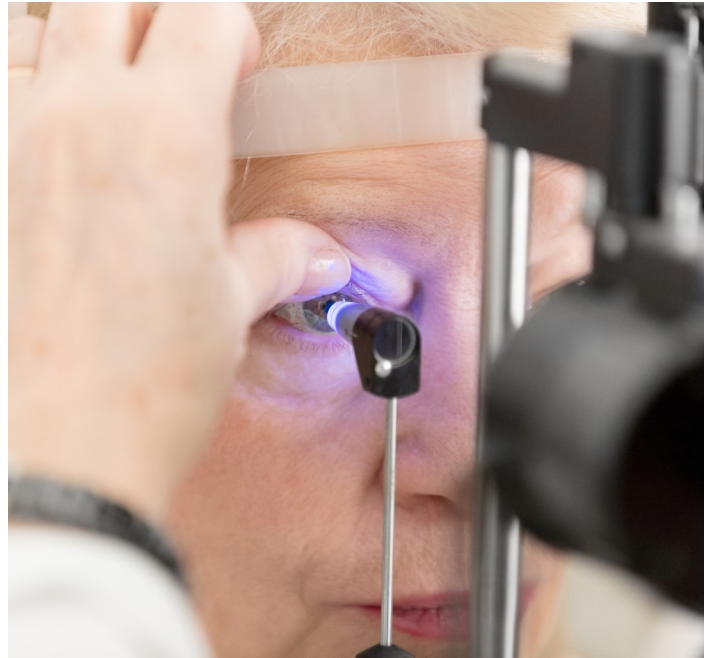
2024 COST-OF-LIVING ADJUSTMENT (COLA)

For 2024, more than 71 million Americans will receive a 3.2% increase in Social Security and Supplemental Security Income (SSI) benefits. In addition, the standard monthly Medicare Part B premiums will be \$174.90 for 2024. GLAUCOMA AWARENESS MONTH

January is Glaucoma Awareness Month. Glaucoma is the leading cause of vision loss and blindness in the United States and has no early symptoms, so it's important to have regular dilated eye exams. Anyone can get glaucoma, but those at higher risk include people who are over age 60, are Black/African American and over age 40, are Hispanic/Latino, or have a family history of glaucoma. There is no cure, but early treatment can often stop it from damaging people's vision.
