PAINT-A-THON APPLICATIONS DUE JULY 1

Do you own your home and does the exterior need to be painted? You might qualify to get your home painted for FREE as part of the 38th Annual Community Paint-A-Thon. To qualify, homes must be owned and occupied by seniors aged 60 and older, people with disabilities, and/or veterans of any age. Owners must be financially disadvantaged or physically unable to paint the exterior of their homes. Homes must be owner-occupied and in sufficient condition so that scraping and spot priming are the only preparations needed. Applications are due by July 1 for painting on September 7.

Paint-A-Thon is also a major volunteer event and we're always looking for teams of volunteers! Volunteers must be at least 16 years of age.

FINANCIAL HELP AND GUIDANCE

Do you need help making ends meet? The Township can assist with many programs, including General Assistance (GA) and Emergency Assistance (EA), that could help. Carefully read the guidelines below for each program and if you have questions call Schaumburg Township Welfare Services at 847-285-4503.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE FOR GENERAL ASSISTANCE?

GA provides monthly direct to vendor financial assistance for eligible clients who do not have enough income or resources for basic needs such as shelter, utilities, food, transportation and personal items.

To qualify, the individual must:

- Reside in Schaumburg Township
- Be 18 or older
- Be a U.S. citizen or qualified immigrant
- Meet financial and non-financial requirements and be ineligible for any other state or federal welfare program. GA has strict income guidelines with a threshold below 100% of the federal poverty level.

GA is a program of last resort. Applicants must first apply for unemployment, social security and state programs through the Department of Human Services for GA eligibility. GA is primarily for adults without minors. Agency and program details below.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE FOR EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE?

EA provides direct to vendor financial support through a crisis such as an eviction or utility disconnection. To qualify, the individual must:

- Reside in Schaumburg Township
- Be a U.S. citizen or qualified immigrant
- Meet financial and non-financial requirements and the grant must alleviate the emergency situation.
- 200% of the federal poverty level; income exemptions may apply.

EA can only be issued once in any twenty-four (24) month period.

COMMUNITY PAPER SHRED AND SMALL ELECTRONICS RECYCLING EVENT JUNE 1



In partnership with the Cook County Sheriff's Office, join us for a free Paper Shred and Small Electronics Recycling event for Township residents on June 1 from 9 - 11 am or until the trucks are full at One Illinois Blvd, Hoffman Estates. Paper shredding is limited to four boxes or paper bags per person (1 cubic ft. or 15" x 12" x 10"). No plastic bags please. Boxes must be unsealed. Paper clips, binder clips and rubber bands must be removed. Small electronic items accepted are:

- Cables (all types)
- Cell Phones/Telephone Devices
- Computers/Laptops
- Hardware/Motherboards
- Holiday Lights
- Monitors/Calculators
- Printers/Fax Machines
- Game Systems/Stereos
- Televisions (1 per household)
- Toasters/Blenders
- Toner Cartridges
- UPS Batteries/Car Batteries

We ask that participants enter our parking lot heading southbound on Illinois Blvd. so as not to block traffic on Schaumburg Road. Residents do not need to exit their vehicles to participate. Visit our website or contact the Clerk's Office at 847-285-4561 for more information.

Spring is not far over our horizon. Warmer weather and spring showers bring flooding concerns to the front of our focus. Swale (ditch) maintenance is equally important to property owners and your road district. Each year the road district deploys resources for swale maintenance to ensure that the subdivision drainage flows smoothly and efficiently. This ensures clear roadways and helps to prevent flooding. While normal waterfall events drain quickly, a 100-year downpour takes more time for the swales to recover. KYC HARM REDUCTION RESOURCES

SENIOR FREEZE EXEMPTION

The Low-Income Senior Citizens Assessment Freeze "Senior Freeze" freezes the assessed value of your home for one year. Eligibility includes:

- You or your spouse are 65 years of age or older during the tax year.
- The property must be your principle residence during the tax year of the assessment freeze.
- Your total household income did not exceed \$65,000 the prior year for which you are requesting the assessment freeze.

The automatic renewal of this exemption due to COVID-19 has ended and you must resume filing annually. Applicants need their 2022 Income tax returns or their Social Security (1099) Statements for year 2022 to file. All exemptions are reflected on the 2nd Installment Property Tax bill when issued. Call the Township Assessor's Office at 847-285-4567 with any questions regarding property tax exemptions.

VETERANS WITH DISABILITIES EXEMPTION

The Veterans with Disabilities Exemption is for veterans with a serviceconnected disability as certified by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (USDVA). Per new legislation, any veteran deemed 100% disabled and classified as "permanently and totally disabled" by the USDVA, will be automatically renewed during Tax Year 2023 (in 2024). Please note: all veterans not included in these designations must renew his/her exemption annually.
