DEAF SERVICES AVAILABLE AT SCHAUMBURG TOWNSHIP

For 32 years the Township of Schaumburg has been the only township in Illinois to offer Deaf and Hard of Hearing services. Deaf Services Coordinator Sarita Phadke is fluent in American Sign Language (ASL) and provides free counseling on benefit programs such as Medicare, RTA, Social Security, Benefit Access Program, Medicaid and more. She also helps with advocacy, referrals and information.

Beyond these vital services, Coordinator Phadke hosts a monthly Deaf Social/Support Group that offers socialization, games and educational presentations. Deaf Services also coordinates monthly educational health presentations, a Diabetes Support Group for the Deaf, virtual bingo and coffee chat, field trips, cooking classes, breakfast social and much more - all in ASL or with a certified interpreter. The Deaf Services Coordinator is a bridge within the Township and assists clients when working with other Township departments.

To meet the growing demand for programming and services, Schaumburg Township is undergoing a transformative construction project. Splitting our multipurpose room into two levels with flexible floor plans will maximize usable space. This project has been designed to best use the space that we already have and will add 2,837 square feet to the Township. Its movable partitions make up to seven additional meeting rooms as well as several offices. This renovation essentially doubles our meeting spaces and can accommodate groups large and small.

Through all the change, our Board's vision to improve the lives of all those we serve has held constant. 

Walk-ups on the day of the event will **NOT** be accepted. This event is limited to the first 500 guests and will fill quickly, so please register early. Please note:

- The person with the disability must reside in the Village of Schaumburg or the Township of Schaumburg.
- All persons with disabilities must have an able-bodied adult to accompany them on the rides. No exceptions.
- NOT ALL RIDES WILL BE OPEN! The carnival operator is a separate entity and has sole discretion on which rides will be open.

The event is weather-dependent and may be cancelled or delayed. The event will not be rescheduled if cancelled. Free Rides is hosted by the Village of Schaumburg, sponsored by Fantasy Amusement Company, Inc. and coordinated by the Township of Schaumburg.

FREE RABIES VACCINE AND MICROCHIP CLINIC SEPTEMBER 14

In partnership with Cook County Department of Animal and Rabies Control, the Township is proud to host a free rabies vaccine and microchip clinic on September 14 from 10 - 1 pm or until vaccines run out at One Illinois Blvd, Hoffman Estates. Owners must be Cook County residents and present a valid driver's license or state ID. Pets must be at least three months old and will be seen on a first-comefirst-served basis. Owners will be given a vaccine certificate and can order a rabies tag post event here: cookcountyil.gov/service/rabies-vaccination-tags. FREE DRUG TAKEBACK BOX COLLECTS 175 LBS



The Township is delighted to report that our Drug Takeback collection box, in partnership with Cook County Sheriff's Office, has been in place for seven months and has collected 175 lbs. of unused prescription drugs. The collection box is free, safe and anonymous for all unused and expired prescription and non-prescription drugs. No

liquids or syringes are accepted, and drugs should not be brought into the Township building. Remember when it comes to unused/expired prescription drugs:

- Don't toss or flush.
- Don't leave them lying around unattended.
- Don't throw them in the trash or down the sink.
- Don't flush them down the toilet.

PROTECT YOURSELF FROM PASSPORT SCAMS

Beware of scammers taking advantage of the rising demand for passports and long processing times. You should never pay to fill out or download passport applications. All applications are available for free on schaumburgtownship.org or travel.state. gov. Consider these tips to stay protected.

Avoid unsolicited offers: Ignore unexpected emails, texts or calls offering passport services. Government agencies will not contact applicants out of the blue.

Know the fees: Processing fees for passports are the same across all acceptance agencies and applications are free online at any time.

Apply in person: You cannot apply for any passport online at this time. You must appear in front of a licensed passport acceptance agent in-person.

Verify sources: Only use official agency websites from the U.S. Department of State or the Township – scammers create fake websites that mimic official sources.

Protect information: Do not share personal or financial details with someone claiming to expedite a passport application, especially online or over the phone.

The Township passport service is walk-in only Monday - Friday from 9 - 4 pm. Call the Clerk's Office at 847-285-4561 with any questions!

FROM THE DESK OF THE HIGHWAY COMMISSIONER: SCOTT M. KEGARISE

Construction season has arrived. Engineering studies are now in process for Spring South. This roadway is approximately 50% incorporated and 50% unincorporated. The Village of Schaumburg and Schaumburg Township Road District have entered into an intergovernmental agreement to secure funding in support of this proposed project. The estimated cost of rebuilding one of the heaviest traveled roadways in the Township in \$5,000,000.00. As with all construction projects, this will be a temporary inconvenience to our residents but will yield long-term area improvements in traffic flow, parking and storm drainage. Not only will this area soon come under construction, but other residential roads in the unincorporated area are also scheduled for repair or milling and renovation. Please slow down in construction areas. Workers want to go home to family not the hospital. Our decennial report is complete and filed with the county. Thanks to our team for the professional efforts they accomplish on a daily basis. We are truly fortunate to have such dedicated staff working on behalf of Schaumburg Township taxpayers.

NEW AUTOMATIC RENEWAL OF THE PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES EXEMPTION FOR TAX YEAR 2023

Residents who received the Persons with Disability Exemption last year (tax year 2022) will be automatically renewed going forward. New applicants for this calendar year will need to complete an application. The Person with Disabilities Exemption provides an annual \$2,000 reduction in the equalized assessed value (EAV) of the property. Residents with questions can call the Township Assessor's Office at 847-285-4567.

SECOND INSTALLMENT PROPERTY TAX BILLS MAILED IN JULY

Second installment property tax bills are typically mailed in July. The balance is calculated by subtracting the first installment from the total taxes due for the present year. Second installment bills should reflect all successful appeals and exemptions.

A MESSAGE FROM SUPERVISOR TIM HENEGHAN

Many people in the community know the Township of Schaumburg for our robust food pantry. Or perhaps they are familiar with our Assessor's Office during property tax appeals time. However, the Township has a litany of services that some may not know about. For example, did you know the Township offers FREE notary public service? We have several notaries on staff who will notarize documents without an appointment needed. A list of accepted documents for notarization can be found at tinyurl.com/79a7p3a9. Residents may also be aware of our no-appointment-needed passport service but may not know we take passport photos for \$10. The Township also offers monthly support groups for the Deaf community, caregivers and people affected by Alzheimer's disease and dementia, diabetes, fibromyalgia and pregnancy and infant loss. Information on these free support groups can be found at tinyurl. com/478xhbtt. The Township is also one of the few Illinois Telecommunications Access Corporation (ITAC) testing centers in our area! ITAC offers free phone equipment to qualified Illinois residents with a certified hearing loss. Qualified residents can test the phones at the Township to select the phone with the optimal hearing results for them. Each phone has varying levels of amplification and adjustments for tone and clarity. Make an appointment with Disability & Senior Services at 847-285-4541.
