A LETTER TO THE COMMUNITY

After years of high prices, many families who typically have no issue paying their bills have found themselves in a tough spot. The Township has seen many such families in the last year. We've served over 700 new families at the pantry in this fiscal year. We've also heard from many in the community that their income is too high for assistance programs, but they still aren't making enough to manage their household bills. It is important for the community to know that many assistance programs have low-income thresholds. Some as low as 100% of the Federal Poverty Level (FPL) and some require essentially no income nor assets to qualify. For reference, 100% of FPL in 2024 is \$15,060 for one person and \$31,200 for a family of 4 annually*. We also know that accepting help, be it food or financial assistance, can be hard for many to accept, especially in an affluent community like Schaumburg Township.

We want you to know that if you express a need and are at our doors asking for assistance – we will help. We do not want you to go hungry.

If it is between food and rent, let us help by getting some food in the fridge so you can stay housed. Visiting the pantry once or 20 times doesn't mean you'll need

AARP TAX-AIDE

AARP Tax-Aide seeks to help low- to moderate-income taxpayers file their state and federal returns at no cost. Each year, the Township partners with the AARP Foundation to provide free income tax assistance. Appointments will be available from February through early April and will be scheduled on a first-come, first-served, first available basis. To help as many people as possible, taxpayers must have all their tax documents collected before scheduling an appointment.

The Tax-Aide appointment line will be open Monday - Friday from 9 - 4 pm beginning January 22. Please call 847-285-4597 to schedule an appointment. Due to the large number of calls for this popular program, all appointments must be made through this call line and walk-ins will be directed to call the appointment line. No wait lists will be created. Residents who miss their appointment without cancelling at least 24 hours prior will be unable to schedule another appointment without approval from the Site Coordinator.

Single Occupancy: \$1,260

Registration: Open until full or March 1, 2025

Join us and Diamond Tours as we travel south to Savannah, Georgia, for a 7-day/6-night tour. During the trip you'll visit Victorian homes, the historic district, Jekyll and St. Simons islands and the Parris Island Marine base. Attendees will enjoy a show at the historic Savannah Theatre. A daily itinerary is available in Disability and Senior Services. Cost includes transportation, 6 nights of lodging, most breakfasts and dinners, tours, hotels, gratuity and taxes. A \$75 deposit is due at registration and final payment is due March 11, 2025. Payment can be split into 3 payments of \$288 for double occupancy or \$395 for single occupancy with installments due January 1, February 1 and March 1.

Last year, my Trustee Take article announced the Township Transportation Department's transition to a full electric fleet. The project is underway, and we anticipate electric buses to be transporting Township residents in 2025. There are many reasons the Township is making a turn to electric buses. For starters, electric buses have much less impact on the environment. They release lower emissions and thus decrease the Township's carbon footprint. They also often have a longer bus lifecycle and require less maintenance, which decreases costs over time and should decrease service disruption for our clients.

In order to operate the electric fleet, the Township is working closely with the Village of Hoffman Estates and ComEd to install charging stations in the south parking lot. The infrastructure improvement is an important step to realizing this transportation evolution. The move to electric buses is one part of the many green initiatives launched in the last several years, including the addition of solar panels and LED building lights. Making these adjustments decreases costs and energy consumption to the benefit of Township residents. The hope is to complete the electric bus transition in the next several years and I, for one, cannot wait to hop on one of the new buses as soon as they are available.

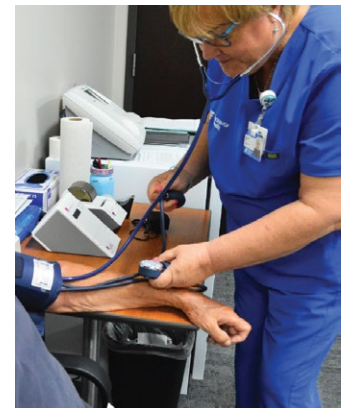

FREE AND LOW-COST SCREENING SERVICES

Did you know that you can get free screenings for blood pressure, bone density and memory loss at the Township? You can also get low-cost screenings for A1C (\$12) and cholesterol (\$15). Regularly keeping an eye on your health is one of the best ways to prevent



major health problems. To take advantage of these services simply make an appointment with Nurse Janet, RN, at 847-285-4551. She is at the Township (One Illinois Blvd., Hoffman Estates IL 60103) every Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday from 8:30 to 4 pm.

MOBILE DENTAL CLINIC

Endeavor Health's Mobile Dental Clinic provides dental care for residents of the Township who do not have access to dental care due to financial barriers. To be eligible for services, patients must meet the following requirements:

- Be a Township of Schaumburg resident
- Have a household income at or below 200% of the federal poverty level or be a General Assistance or Medicaid recipient
- Have NO private dental insurance

Residents must be screened by a Township caseworker before scheduling an appointment with the Mobile Dental Clinic. Please call 847-285-4503 to schedule a screening appointment.

Volunteering just two hours a week provides nutritious meals and wellness checks to homebound seniors across the Township. According to the National Alliance on Mental Illness, 66% of people report feeling lonely during the holidays, with 64% of people with mental illness reporting their condition worsens during the holidays. NOW AVAILABLE: ONLINE PASSPORT RENEWAL

Eligible U.S. passport holders can now renew online at travel.state.gov/renewonline. Applicants must meet the following requirements to apply online per the U.S. Department of State*:

- The passport you are renewing is or was valid for 10 years, and you are age 25 or older.
- The passport was issued between 2009 and 2015. The passport was issued over 9 years but less than 15 years from the date you plan to submit your application.
- You are not changing your name, gender, date of birth or place of birth.
- You are not traveling for at least 6 weeks from the date you will submit your application. Only routine service is available.
- You are applying for a regular (tourist) passport. You cannot renew a special issuance (diplomatic, official, service) passport online.
- You live in the United States (either state or territory). You do not qualify to renew online if you live in a foreign country or have an Army Post Office (APO), Fleet Post Office (FPO), or Diplomatic Post Office (DPO) address.
- You have your passport with you, and it is not damaged or mutilated, and you have not reported it as lost or stolen.
- You can pay for your passport using a credit or debit card.
- You can upload a digital passport photo.

Please note that once you apply online, your passport is invalid and cannot be used for international travel. Applicants will also need to have a current, digital photo available to upload to apply online. There are special requirements for passport photos. Find more information on digital photos here: tinyurl.com/47t4axmy.

Should an online renewal seem burdensome, please know that you can still apply through the mail. Township staff can assist with mail renewals Monday-Friday 9 - 4 pm. No appointment needed. Printed photos available, two for \$10.

COOK COUNTY BOARD OF REVIEW RESIDENTIAL PROPERTY TAX APPEALS

The Cook County Board of Review residential property tax appeal period is projected to happen in December 2024 or early 2025. Exact dates will be posted on cookcountyboardofreview.com when available. Residents can appeal regardless of the outcome of a Cook County Assessor appeal. The Township's Assessor Office will accept appeals virtually and in-person during the open appeals period. E-mail appeals are the fastest and most convenient way to appeal. Simply email vmorales@schtwn.org your name, home address, property index number (PIN #), phone number and email address. Please do not send multiple appeal requests for one property.

FIRST INSTALLMENT COOK COUNTY PROPERTY TAX BILL

The first installment of the Cook County property tax bills is slated to be mailed in February 2025. Discover all the ways to pay and what is owed in the first installment on cookcountytreasurer.com. Click on the purple box titled "Your Property Tax Overview" and enter your property's unique property index number (PIN #). Please note that any successful appeals appear on the second installment tax bill, not the first.

As 2024 comes to a close, I want to take the opportunity to thank our generous community donors. Without your assistance, we wouldn't have been able to help feed the record number of neighbors in Schaumburg Township this year. The Township assisted, on average, just under 1,200 households in the pantry or with emergency food each month this fiscal year. This equates to just under 3,500 household members served monthly. We also received a 37% increase in school supply donations for our Pack the Bus drive benefiting School District 54. And as this Town Crier issue goes to print, our signature holiday gift adoption programs are underway. Donations come in sizes big and small, and all are important to the people we serve.
