RABIES VACCINE AND MICROCHIP CLINIC SEPTEMBER 6

The Township is proud to host a rabies vaccine and microchip clinic on September 6 from 10 - 1 pm, or until vaccines run out, at 1 Illinois Blvd, Hoffman Estates. Owners must be Cook County residents and present a valid driver's license or state ID. Dogs and cats must be at least three months old and will be seen on a first-come-first-served basis.

Vaccines and microchips are free however the rabies vaccine tag is \$6 and can be ordered at cookcountyil.gov/service/rabies-vaccination-tags. Owners will be given a vaccine certificate for free. SECOND INSTALLMENT PROPERTY TAX BILLS DELAYED

Homeowners should be prepared to receive their second installment of their property taxes from Cook County later than normal. Second installment bills are typically mailed in July and typically due in August. At the time of printing, it is unclear when they will be mailed and when they will be due. As a reminder, second installments should reflect any exemptions or successful appeals.

COOK COUNTY ASSESSOR PROPERTY TAX APPEALS TENTATIVELY SCHEDULED IN FALL

Property tax appeals with the Cook County Assessor's Office are expected to be open this fall, maybe as soon as September. This year, 2025, is a triennial reassessment year, which means each property in the Township will be reassessed. Residents should pay close attention to their reassessment and work with the Township Assessor's Office to file an appeal for free.

Information on when and how to appeal will be available on the Township's website and social media. Residents can also sign up for eNewsletters at schaumburgtownship.org (at the bottom of the homepage) to get a notice emailed to them when appeals are open and how to apply.
