RESOLUTION 2026-2027 #7

**A RESOLUTION
OF THE TOWNSHIP BOARD OF THE TOWNSHIP OF SCHAUMBURG
AUTHORIZING SUBMISSION OF A BINDING PUBLIC QUESTION CONCERNING
ABOLITION OF THE SCHAUMBURG TOWNSHIP ROAD DISTRICT
AT THE NOVEMBER 3, 2026, GENERAL ELECTION**

WHEREAS, Schaumburg Township (the “Township”), also known as the Township of Schaumburg, is located in Cook County, Illinois; and

WHEREAS, the Schaumburg Township Road District (the “Road District”), also known as the Schaumburg Township Road and Bridge District, is a single township road district located entirely within the Township; and

WHEREAS, the Illinois Highway Code (the “Highway Code”), 605 ILCS 5/6-133, authorizes the board of trustees of a township located in Cook County, by resolution, to submit a proposition to abolish the road district of that township to the electors of the township at a general or consolidated election in accordance with the general election law; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of Schaumburg Township (the “Township Board”) has determined that the electors should decide whether the Road District will be abolished and that submitting the proposition to the electors at the November 3, 2026, General Election is in the best interests of the Township and its residents; and

WHEREAS, if a majority of the electors voting on the proposition vote in favor of it, the Road District will be abolished by operation of law effective May 19, 2029, which is the date on which the term of the Highway Commissioner in office at the time the proposition is approved by the electors expires, consistent with Section 6-133 of the Highway Code; and

WHEREAS, on that statutory effective date, all the rights, powers, duties, assets, property, liabilities, obligations, and responsibilities of the Road District shall, by operation of law, vest in and be assumed by the Township; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Supervisor and Board of Trustees of the Township of Schaumburg, County of Cook, State of Illinois, as follows:

SECTION ONE: RECITALS. The recitals set forth above are incorporated into this Resolution as though fully set forth herein.

SECTION TWO: SUBMISSION OF PUBLIC QUESTION. The following binding public question (the “Binding Proposition”) shall be submitted to the electors of the Township at the November 3, 2026, General Election, in substantially the following form, as prescribed by Section 6-133 of the Highway Code:

Shall the Road District of the Township of Schaumburg be abolished with all the rights, powers, duties, assets, property, liabilities, obligations, and responsibilities being assumed by the Township of Schaumburg?	YES NO
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SECTION THREE: DIRECTION & AUTHORIZATION.

(A) The Township Clerk, as the Township’s local election official, is authorized and directed, no later than August 27, 2026, which is not less than sixty-eight (68) days before the November 3, 2026, General Election, to certify the Binding Proposition to each election authority having jurisdiction over any portion of the Township in accordance with 10 ILCS 5/28-5.

(B) The certification shall include the form of the Binding Proposition, the date on which this Resolution was adopted, a certified copy of this Resolution, and any other ministerial information required by applicable law or the applicable election authority.

(C) The Township Supervisor, Township Clerk, and their respective designees are authorized to take any additional ministerial actions reasonably necessary to implement this Resolution and complete the certification process.

SECTION FOUR: NEUTRAL INFORMATION. Subject to available appropriations, applicable procurement requirements, and applicable law, the Township Supervisor and the Supervisor's designee(s) may prepare and disseminate neutral and factual information concerning the Binding Proposition. No Township funds or resources, including Township personnel, facilities, equipment, communications systems, or other Township resources, may be used to urge any elector to vote for or against the Binding Proposition. This Section does not independently authorize any particular study, expenditure, consultant engagement, or communication other than neutral and factual information concerning the Binding Proposition.

SECTION FIVE: SEVERABILITY. If any provision of this Resolution is held invalid or unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining provisions shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION SIX: REPEALER. Any prior resolution or part thereof that directly conflicts with this Resolution is superseded and repealed solely to the extent of the conflict.

SECTION SEVEN: EFFECTIVENESS. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage and approval.
